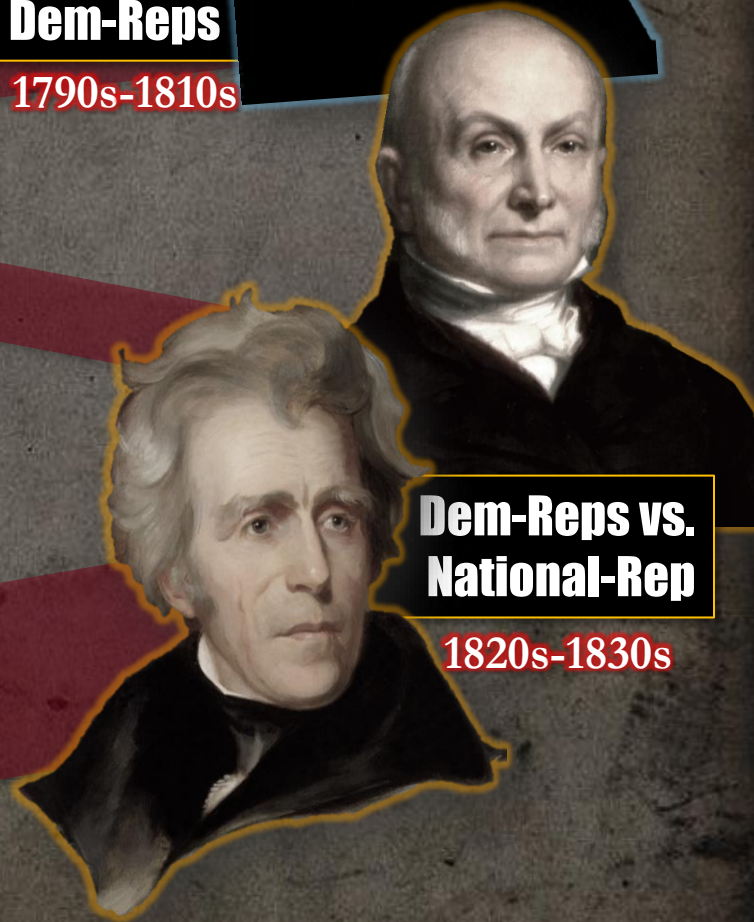

14 electoral votes

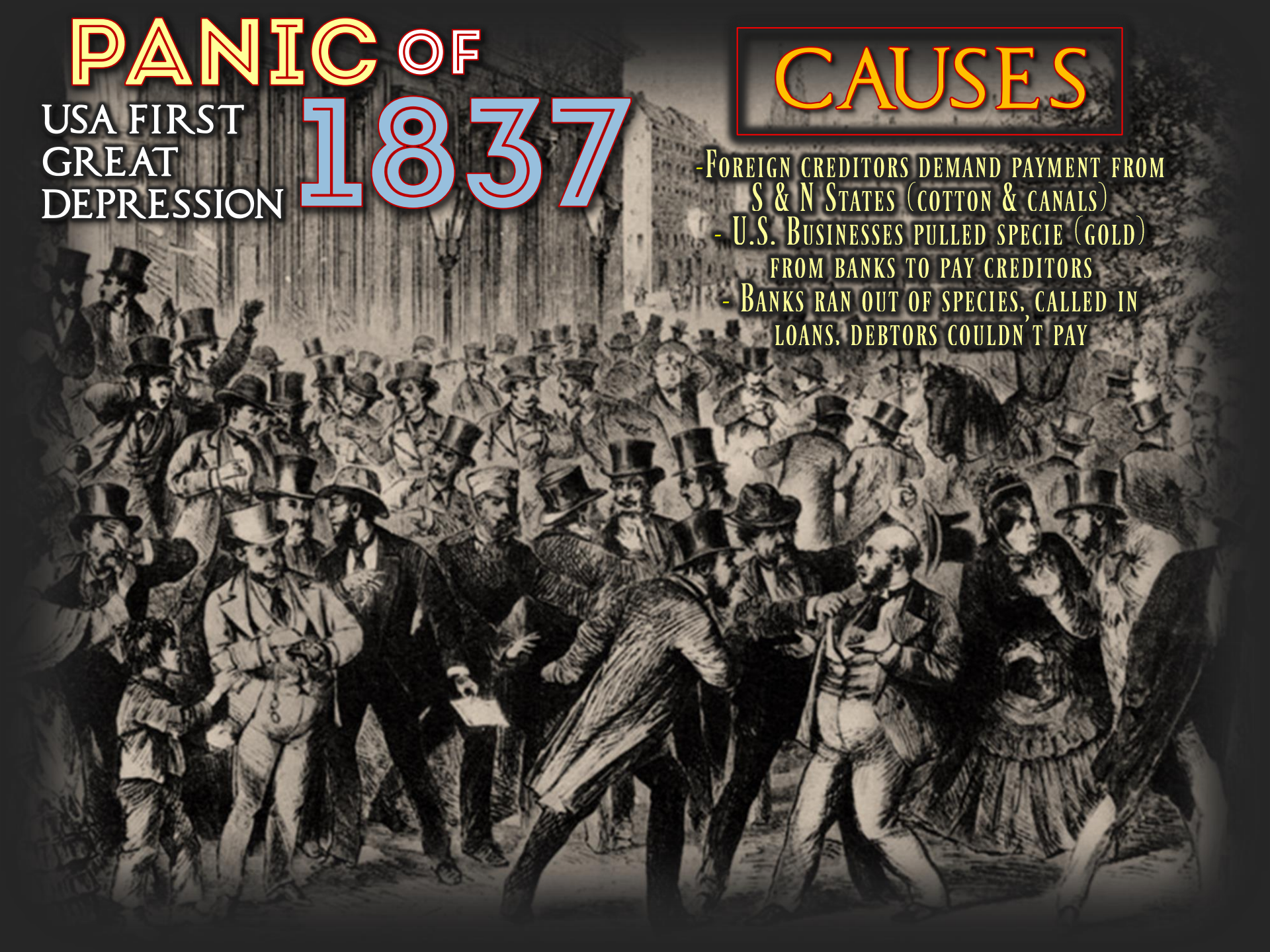
**Mangum (Anti-Jackson)**

# PANIC OF USA FIRST GREAT DEPRESSION 1837

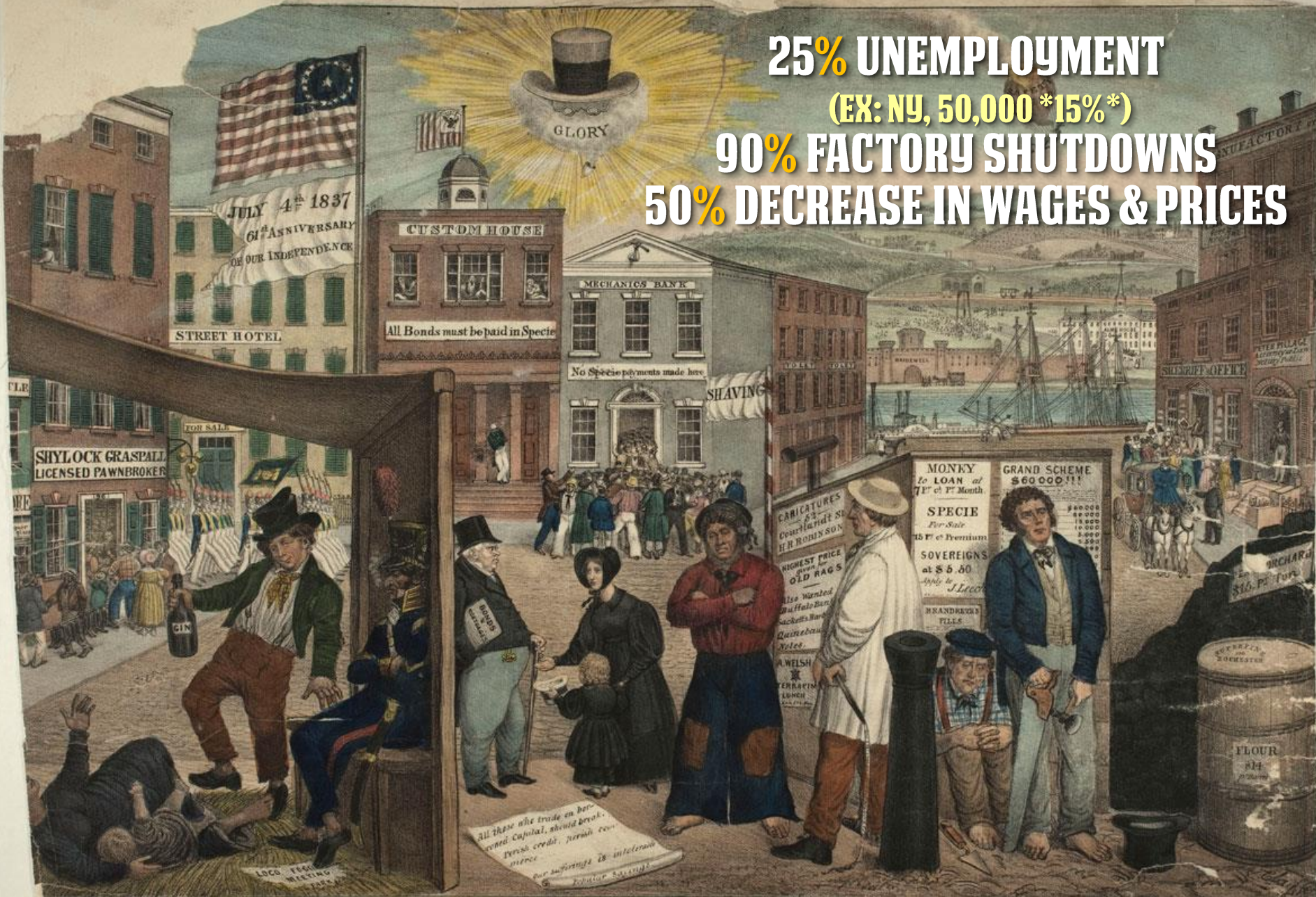
## CAUSES

- FOREIGN CREDITORS DEMAND PAYMENT FROM S & N STATES (COTTON & CANALS)
- U.S. BUSINESSES PULLED SPECIE (GOLD) FROM BANKS TO PAY CREDITORS
- BANKS RAN OUT OF SPECIES, CALLED IN LOANS, DEBTORS COULDN'T PAY



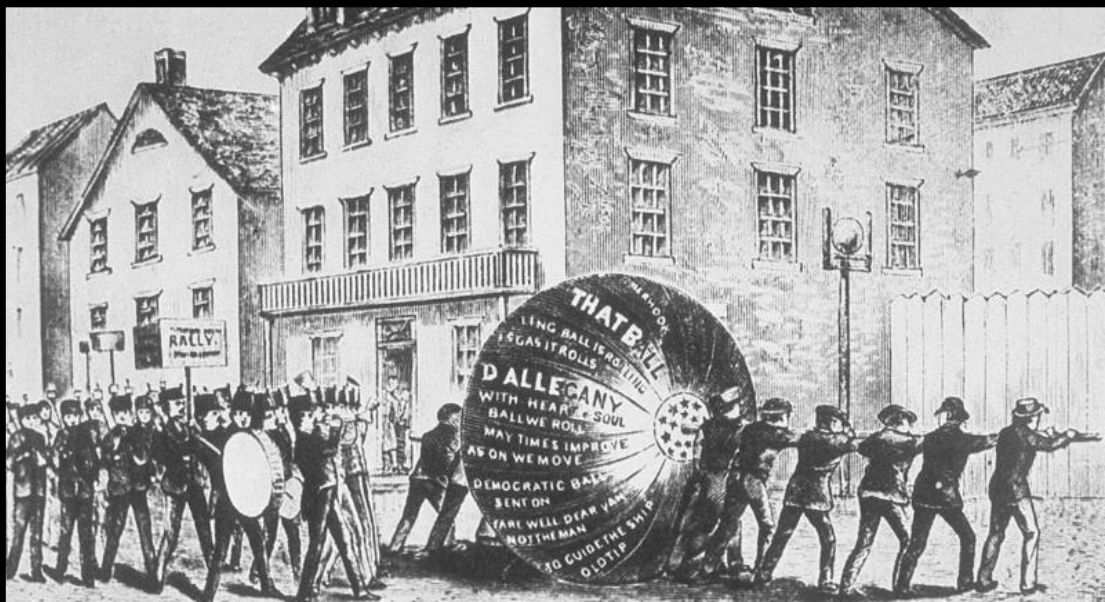
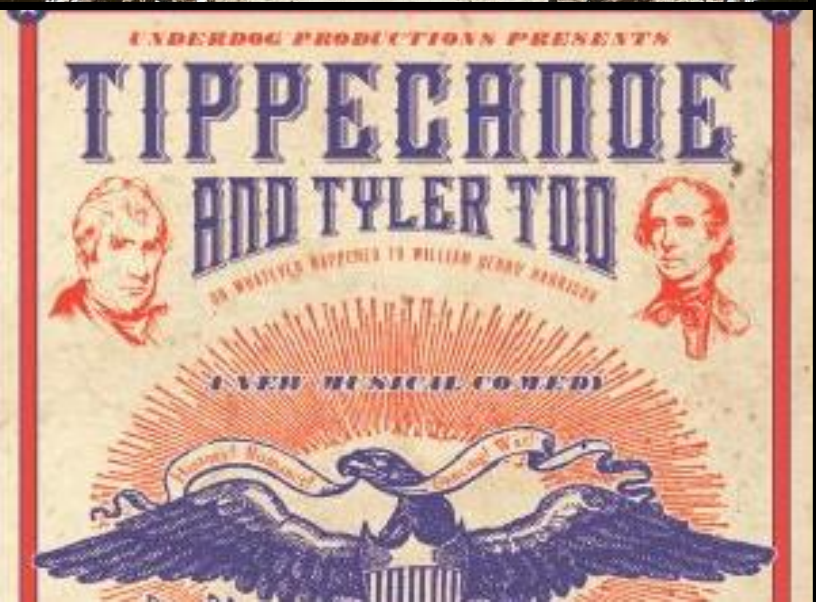
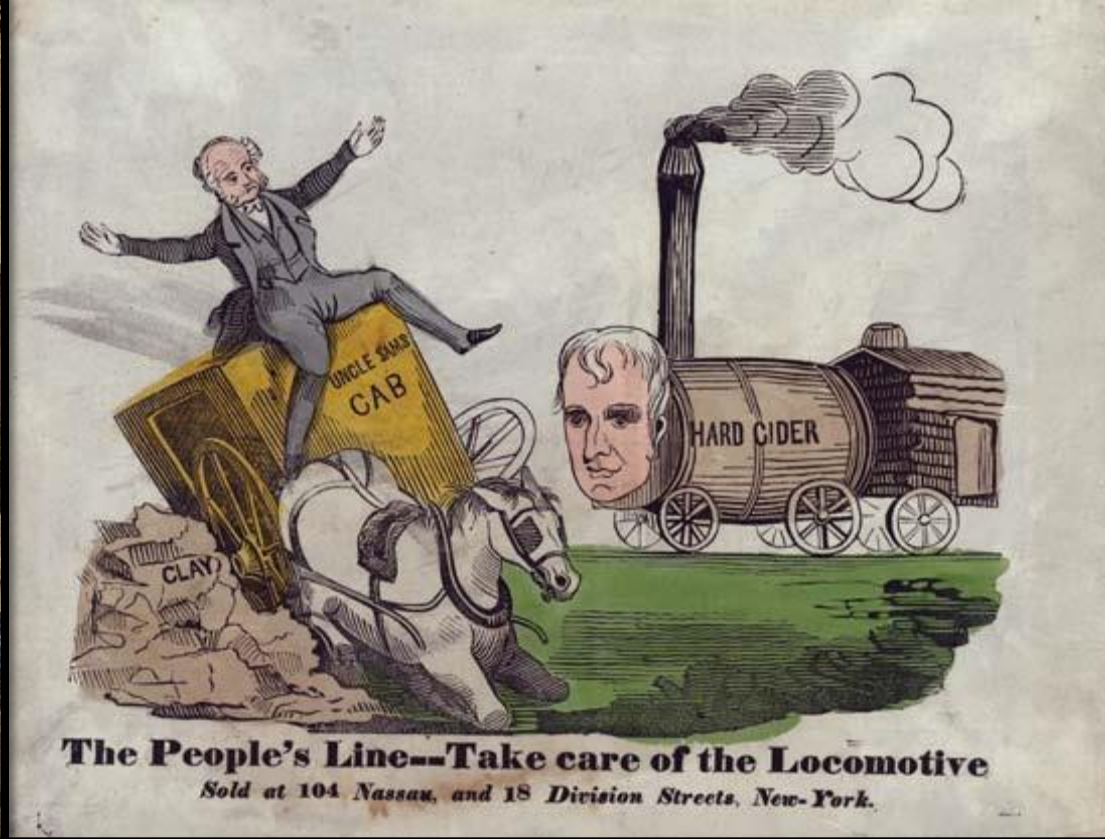

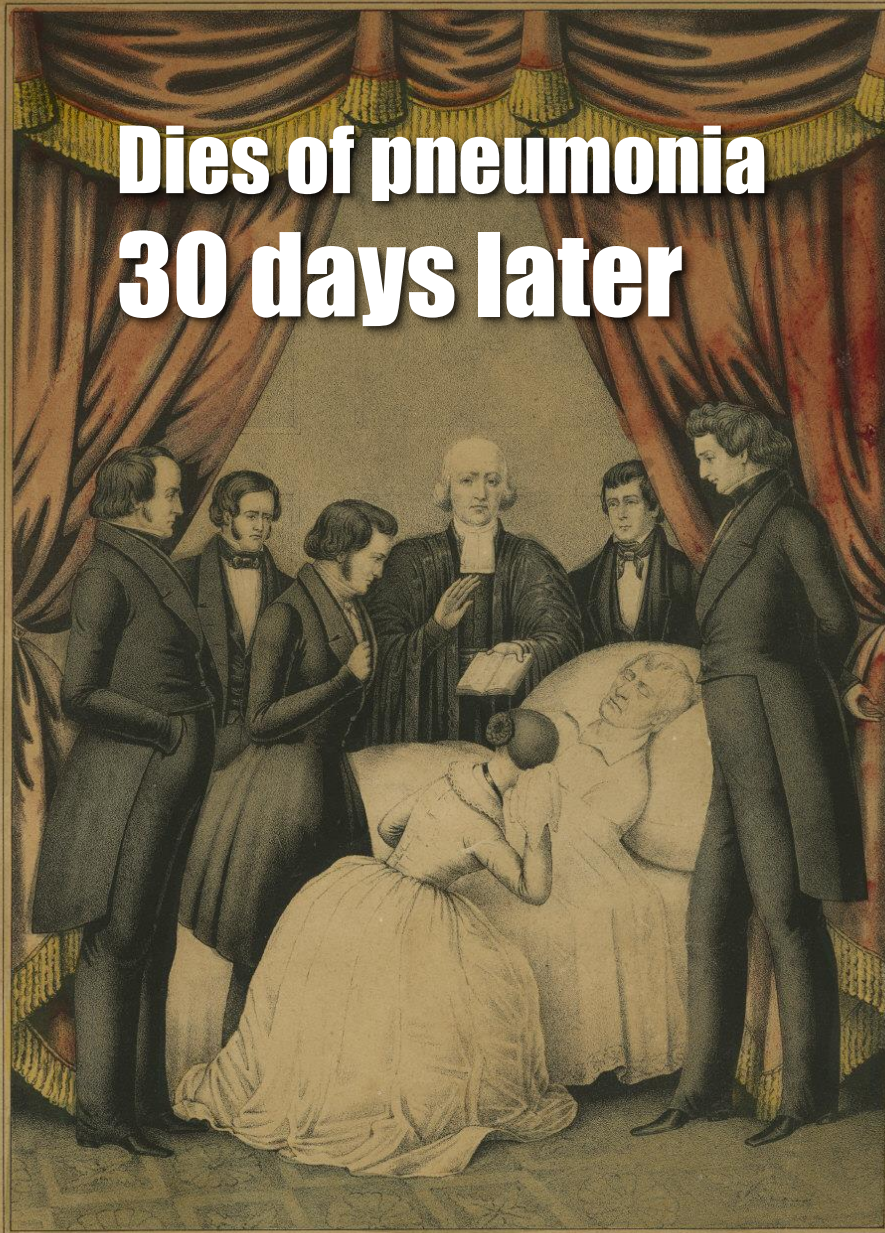

**DEATH OF WILLIAM HENRY HARRISON.**

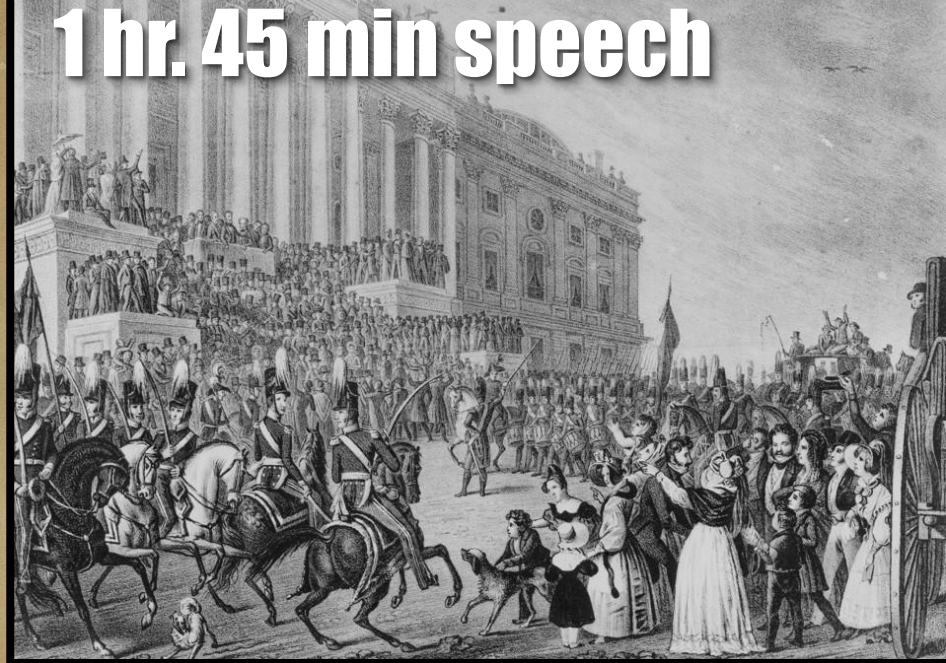

*"I wish you to understand the true principles of the Government. I wish them carried out. I ask nothing more."*

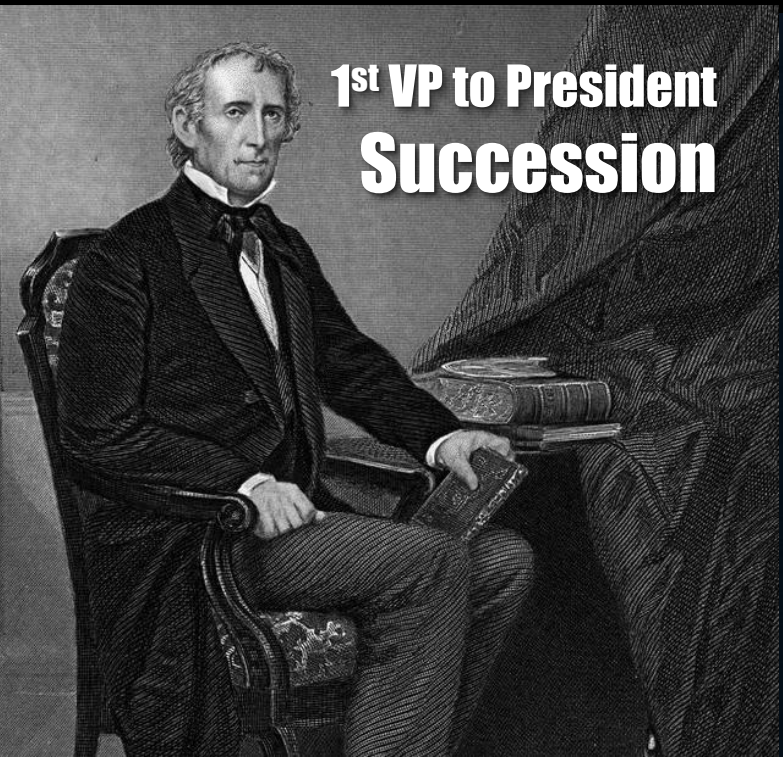

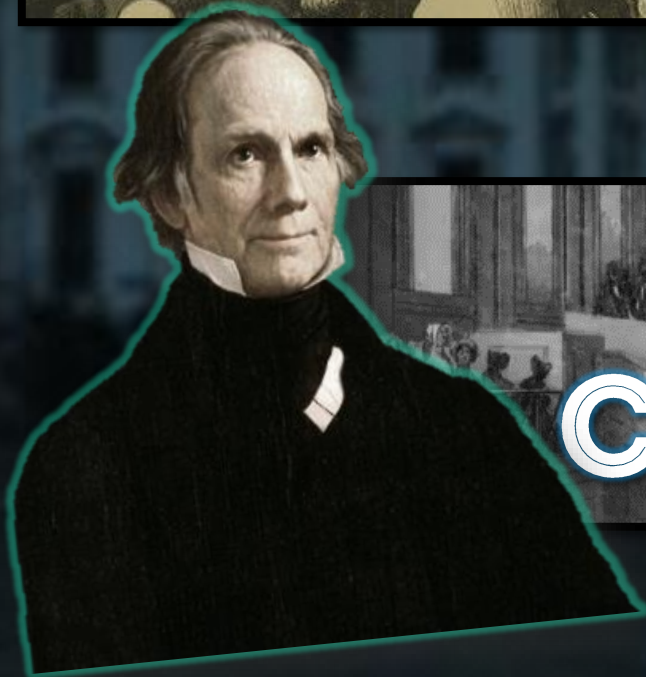
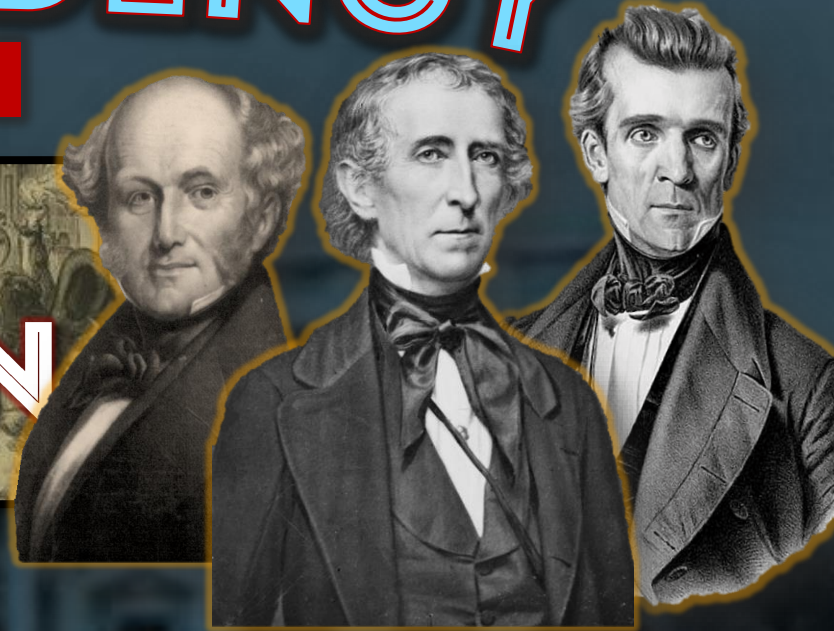
